- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 20-167, the Kansas Supreme Court may establish a supervision fee schedule to be charged a juvenile offender, or the parent or guardian of such juvenile offender, if the juvenile offender is under the age of 18, for certain services rendered.
- 2. There is hereby established a juvenile supervision fee in an amount no higher than the amount set for an adult supervision fee, pursuant to K.S.A. 21-4610a, and amendments thereto, for cases in which the juvenile is adjudicated for an offense which, if committed by an adult, would constitute a felony and for cases in which the juvenile is adjudicated for an offense which, if committed by an adult, would constitute a misdemeanor. These supervision fees shall be charged and collected by the clerks of the district courts and paid into the county general fund to be used to fund community juvenile justice programs.
- 3. The court may waive all or part of the supervision fee set forth by this Order upon a showing that such fee will result in an undue hardship to the juvenile offender or the parent or guardian of the juvenile offender.
- 4. This order shall be effective for cases filed on or after March 14, 2011.
